Der Abschlussband des deutsch-französischen ANR-DFG-Projekts MUSICI widmet sich der Musikermigration im Europa der Frühen Neuzeit mit einem kultur- und musikgeschichtlichen Blick auf Venedig, Rom und Neapel als Reiseziele und Wirkungsorte von Instrumentalisten, Sängern, Komponisten und Instrumentenbauern, die nicht von der italienischen Halbinsel stammten. Im Sinne einer "histoire croisée" werden Netzwerke, Integrations- und Austauschprozesse aufgedeckt, mit denen fremde Musiker zwischen musikalischem Alltag und herausragenden Festlichkeiten konfrontiert waren. Auf dieser Grundlage wird eine systematische Betrachtung der frühneuzeitlichen Musikermigration sowie eine Untersuchung musikalischer Stile jenseits nationaler Forschungstraditionen möglich. Nella scienza giuridica, come in ogni altra scienza, esistono territori poco esplorati. Il diritto delle arti e dello spettacolo ne costituisce un chiaro esempio, poiché rappresenta un ambito disciplinare poco indagato dai giuristi e dagli operatori del settore, sebbene questi ultimi si confrontino quotidianamente con le tante problematiche giuridiche connesse al fenomeno artistico. L'idea di affrontare in maniera organica questa disciplina, dunque, risponde a una duplice esigenza. Da un lato, questo manuale può rappresentare un valido supporto didattico per chi voglia avvicinarsi allo studio degli istituti ascrivibili al diritto delle arti e dello spettacolo. Dall'altro lato, esso può costituire un valido strumento per l'operatore chiamato a risolvere in punto di diritto i tanti problemi che si pongono in sede di progettazione e realizzazione di uno spettacolo o di diffusione e tutela di un'opera d'arte. Gli autori affrontano i vari temi sviluppando l'approccio multidisciplinare suggerito dal curatore dell'opera. Categorie tradizionali del diritto pubblico — costituzionalistiche, amministrativistiche e penalistiche — e istituti del diritto privato — id est: del diritto civile, del diritto commerciale e del diritto del lavoro — vengono analizzati congiuntamente con l'obiettivo di offrire al lettore una visione integrale della materia. Completano il lavoro le frequenti incursioni in ambiti disciplinari non strettamente giuridici: le riflessioni dei singoli autori, infatti, tengono nella giusta considerazione la centralità dell'espressione artistica, che per sua natura è retta dalle leggi non giuridiche dell'estetica, della sociologia, del marketing e della comunicazione. We know a lot about the directors and stars of Italian cinema's heyday, from Roberto Rossellini to Sophia Loren. But what do we know about the Italian audiences that went to see their films? For the first time, cinema's role in everyday Italian life, and its affective meaning when remembered by older people, are enriched with industrial analyses of the booming Italian film sector of the period, as well as contextual data from popular and specialized magazines. This volume provides the first in-depth collection of essays aimed at critically examining the work of political philosopher Giorgio Agamben. But by the end of the 1980s, the Italian film industry was all but dead. The Rise and Fall of the Italian Film Industry traces the rise of the industry from its origins in the 19th century to its worldwide success in the 1960s, and its rapid decline in the subsequent decades. It does so by looking at cinema as an institution – subject to the interplay between the spheres of art, business, and politics at the national and international level. By examining the roles of a wide range of stakeholders (including film directors, producers, exhibitors, the public, and the critics) as well as the system of funding and the influence of governments, author Marina Nicoli demonstrates that the Italian film industry succeeded when all three spheres were aligned, but suffered and ultimately failed when they each pursued contradictory objectives. This in-depth case study makes an important contribution to the long-standing debate about promoting and protecting domestic cultures, particularly in the face of culturally dominant and politically- and economically-powerful creative industries from the United States. The Rise and Fall of the Italian Film Industry will be of particular interest to business and economic historians, cinema historians, media specialists, and cultural economists. This volume is part of the recent interest in the study of religion and popular media culture (cinema in particular), but it strongly differs from most of this work in this maturing discipline. Contrary to most other edited volumes and monographs on film and religion, Moralizing Cinema will not focus upon films (cf. the representation of biblical figures, religious themes in films, the fidelity question in movies), but rather look beyond the film text, content or aesthetics, by concentrating on the cinema-related actions, strategies and policies developed by the Catholic Church and Catholic organizations in order to influence cinema. Whereas the key role of Catholics in cinema has been well studied in the USA (cf. literature on the Legion of Decency and on the Catholic influenced Production Code Administration), the issue remains unexplored for other parts of the world. The most popular film genre during the golden years of Italian cinema, the Comedy Italian Style emerged after the fall of the Facist regime, narrating the identity crisis of many Italian men.
